Day 1: Hometown – NYC (Self-guided tour in Flushing) – Times Square Hotel

Hotel: New York Marriott Marquis or equivalent

The first day itinerary is for your reference only; the schedule is subject to change upon your arrival.

Thanks for choosing your vacation with us! You can choose any one of the major airports in New York City (JFK, LGA, EWR) when you book your flight. Our professional tour guide will meet you at the baggage claim area for the domestic flight; for international flight, please arrive at the Passenger Waiting Area for pick up. (Passengers, who arrive at Terminal 7 of JFK Airport, please wait outside of the baggage claim area.)

1. Guests who arrive at JFK or LGA airport before 5:00pm will be sent to Flushing Queens. We will provide free luggage storage service, and our guests can visit nearby Queens Crossing, Macy's Shopping Center. In addition, Flushing is a safe and booming Asian commercial and retail area with many shopping and dining options. You will experience the distinctive Asian-American culture.
2. For those who arrive at EWR airport before 12:00PM noon, feel free to take our complimentary shuttle to Jersey Garden Outlet and we will take you back to the hotel as soon as the rooms are ready to check-in.

- **Itinerary: DUMBO (20 mins) → Madison Square & Flatiron Building (Outside view, 20 mins) → Washington Square & New York University (Outside view, 15 mins)**

DUMBO is a neighborhood in the New York City borough of Brooklyn. On December 18, 2007, the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission voted unanimously to designate Dumbo as the city's 90th historic district.

The Flatiron building has been called "one of the world's most iconic skyscrapers and a quintessential symbol of New York City", anchors the south (downtown) end of Madison Square and the north (uptown) end of the Ladies' Mile Historic District. The neighborhood around it is called the Flatiron District after its signature building, which has become an icon of New York City.

Washington Square Park is an open space, dominated by the Washington Square Arch at the northern gateway to the park, with a tradition of celebrating nonconformity. The park's fountain area has long been one of the city's popular spots for residents and tourists. Most of the buildings surrounding the park now belong to New York University.

Reminder: New York Manhattan hotel requires guests to use their own credit card at check-in to pay the deposit and verify identification. If no personal expense occurring during the stay, the hotel will automatically return the corresponding deposit after check-out.

Day 2: New York City Tour – Times Square Hotel

Hotel: New York Marriott Marquis or equivalent

Learn more of the city's unique history, culture, and the core spirit of the New Yorkers with our professional tour guide, New York's many offerings are well known to most visitors. But to explore the real New York, the vibrant, charming, and predictably unpredictable city that engenders such passion among locals and envy among visitors, it helps to have an insider's perspective.

ITINERARY:

Wall Street (25 mins) → Charging Bull (Taking Photos) → One World Observatory (Optional, 70 mins) → Liberty Cruise (Optional, 60 mins) → U.S.S Intrepid (Optional, 90 mins) → Times Square hotel check in → Free time

Free time activities recommendation:

1. You can enjoy vibrant nightlife in the mid-town, great shopping and restaurants are available around Times Square.

2. If you want to enrich your evening time, you can enjoy the Broadway show that starts after 7:00PM. You can also go to the "Believe it or not" where you can experience the world's wonders. (Tour guide can help with booking tickets which are at customer's own expense.)

❖ **Wall Street**

This famous street in New York City's Financial District has become synonymous with American financial enterprises. It is also the home of the New York Stock Exchange and has been (or still is) the location of several other exchanges.

❖ **Charging Bull**

This bronze sculpture that sits at the northern tip of New York's Bowling Green Park is ready to strike! It was commissioned to represent the "strength and power of the American people" after the stock market crashed in 1987.

❖ **NYC Trinity Church**

Built in the mid-1800s, Trinity Church (also called St. Paul's Chapel) is the oldest public building that is in continuous use in NYC. The current church is the third on this site; the first Trinity Church was built in 1698.

❖ **One World Observatory**

One World Trade Center is the main building of the rebuilt World Trade Center complex in Lower Manhattan, New York City. It is the tallest building in the Western Hemisphere. There, 102 stories up, find yourself face-to-face with New York's iconic skyline. Maybe you've seen views of the city before, but never quite like this. Walk the three sprawling levels of the Observatory and discover surprises along the way.

❖ **Liberty Cruise**

The sightseeing cruise tour on the Hudson River to enjoy the city view from a totally different angle, as well as take pictures with the backdrops of Statue of Liberty and Brooklyn Bridge.

❖ **U.S.S Intrepid**

This famous military history museum on Manhattan's West Side is inside the now-defunct World War II aircraft carrier, the USS Intrepid. Exhibits include real military aircraft as well as recreations of military life aboard the ship.

❖ **Times Square**

Called "The Crossroads of the World," this major intersection in midtown Manhattan-- where Broadway hits Seventh Avenue-- is a world-famous icon of both New York City and the United States. It has appeared in countless forms of media.

Day 3: New York City Tour – Times Square Hotel

Hotel: [New York Marriott Marquis](#) or equivalent

Start the tour around noon, today you will learn more of the city's unique history, culture, and the core spirit of the New Yorkers!

Itinerary:

Museum of Modern Art (Optional , 120 mins) → United Nation Headquarters (30 mins, visit the lobby inside) → Metropolitan Museum of Art (Optional , 150 mins including 45 mins guided tour)

Special notes: A valid government-issued photo identification issued by a Member State or an Observer State of the United Nations is required to enter UN Headquarters. If UN Headquarters closed for certain reasons, we will visit outside and take pictures for memory.

❖ **Museum of Modern Art**

The Museum of Modern Art is a place that fuels creativity, ignites minds, and provides inspiration. With extraordinary exhibitions and the world's finest collection of modern and contemporary art, MoMA is dedicated to the conversation between the past and the present, the established and the experimental.

❖ **United Nations Headquarters**

This building in New York City has served as the global headquarters of the United Nations since 1952. The area has extraterritoriality status, meaning it is technically not bound by the laws of New York or even the United States. Although it is situated in New York City, the land occupied by the United Nations Headquarters and the spaces of buildings that it rents are under the sole administration of the United Nations and not the U.S. government.

❖ **Metropolitan Museum of Art**

The Metropolitan Museum of Art is not just the largest art museum in the United States, but also one of the three biggest in the world. Its collection contains more than 2 million works of art.

Day 4: Princeton – Philadelphia – Washington D.C.

Hotel: [Holiday Inn/Crowne Plaza/Shippen Place Hotel](#) or equivalent

In the morning, we will visit Princeton University, one of the prestigious Ivy League universities in United States. A guided campus tour will give our guests the opportunity to know more about American education culture. and then head for Philadelphia where known as the birthplace of American democracy. At last, we will visit Washington memorials, museums, and Americana characterize this historic city.

ITINERARY:

Princeton University Campus Tour (Optional, 60 mins) → Philadelphia → Independence National Historical Park (35 mins), Independence Hall (Outside Visit) and Liberty Bell (Outside Visit) →Philadelphia

One Liberty Observation Deck (Optional, 50 mins) → Washington D.C. → Madame Tussauds Washington DC President Gallery (Optional, 60 mins) → White House (Outside Visit, 20 mins) → Lincoln Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial (40 mins)
We will also pass by: U.S. Treasury, Washington Monument

❖ **Princeton University**

This illustrious university in central New Jersey is one of the oldest and most highly regarded institutions of higher learning in the entire United States of America. It has been associated with 35 Nobel Prize laureates.

❖ **Independence National Historical Park**

This National Historical Park in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania serves as a way of preserving important Revolutionary War sites for future generations. Called "America's most historic square mile," this 55-acre park in the "Old City" district is not to be missed.

❖ **Independence Hall**

One of Philadelphia's most famous landmarks, Independence Hall in Independence National Historical Park is the location where both the Declaration of Independence and the United States Constitution were debated, written, and ratified by the Founding Fathers of the USA.

❖ **Liberty Bell**

The famously cracked Liberty Bell is a sign of American Independence and spirit. Located at Liberty Bell Center in Philadelphia, PA, this symbol of the American Revolution was crafted in 1752-- more than 250 years ago.

❖ **One Liberty Observation Deck**

At the top of One Liberty Tower, visitors can get the best panoramic view of the city of Philadelphia from 57 floors above this beautiful city.

❖ **Madame Tussauds Washington DC**

Madame Tussauds in Washington D.C. which is the only attraction you can get close to the "45 presidents" of US. We will have the chance to explore the inner structure of the White House, taking photographs with Oval Office desk aka The Resolute Desk.

❖ **The White House**

The world-famous White House in Washington, DC is the official residence of the president of the United States and the place where most of the work is done. The facade of this neoclassical mansion is a global icon.

❖ **Lincoln Memorial**

This iconic American monument honors the 16th president of the United States. Abraham Lincoln was president during the American Civil War and is most famous for the Emancipation Proclamation that freed all the slaves in the states. This grand monument overlooks the Reflecting Pool, the Washington Monument and the U.S. Capitol. Inside, the 19-foot marble statue of the 16th president is flanked by inscriptions of his Second Inaugural Address and the famous Gettysburg Address.

❖ **Korean War Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial**

The two monuments honor and commemorate members of the U.S. armed forces who fought in the wars.

Day 5: Washington D.C. (Visit the U.S. Capitol) – New Jersey

Hotel: Crowne (Ramada) Plaza EWR /Sheraton Edison/Doubletree Somerset or equivalent

Today we continue to visit the hub for American politics and history. Visit inside of the Capitol with professional tour guide. And later, we will visit library of Congress (outside) and Supreme Court of the US (outside). Explore more culture and history with taking DC sightseeing cruise and more.

ITINERARY:

(Apply when DC cruise closed, usually during January to March.)

U.S. Capitol (Inside Visit, 90 mins) → Library of Congress (Outside Visit) → Supreme Court of the United States (Outside Visit) → Newseum (Optional, 60 mins) → International Spy Museum (Optional, 60 mins)

(Apply when DC cruise resume, usually during April to December.)

U.S. Capitol (Inside Visit, 90 mins) → Library of Congress (Outside Visit) → Supreme Court of the United States (Outside Visit) → Newseum (Optional, 60 mins) → DC Sightseeing Cruise (Optional, 45 mins)

Special Notes: If the U.S. Capitol closed to visitors, we will see the exterior of the Capitol building from outside. The Capitol Visitor Center is open to visitors from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday except for Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day and on Inauguration Day.

We will also pass by: Washington Monument, the World War II Memorial, the Thomas Jefferson Memorial and etc.

❖ **U.S. Capitol**

The famous United States Capitol is the meeting place of the US Congress, and has been for more than 200 years. The building is famous for its elaborate dome and intricately designed, detailed columns.

❖ **Newseum**

This interactive museum details the history of journalism, news, and media. Established in 1997, it is located in a sleek, modern building filled with multiple theaters and exhibits. It is also where Al Jazeera America has its studios.

❖ **DC Sightseeing Cruise**

The Potomac River runs along Washington, DC, the capital city of the United States of America. Visitors to this famous locale can opt to see many of the area's most historic landmarks and memorials in a unique way.

❖ **International Spy Museum**

Dedicated to all things espionage, the International Spy Museum houses exhibits and collections that detail the history of spying. It features many informative films and interactive activities, like Spy in the City, an GPS-based scavenger hunt.

❖ **Washington Monument**

This iconic obelisk is a memorial to the commander-in-chief of the American revolutionary army and eventual the first president of the United States of America, George Washington. The massive stone structure began construction in 1848.

Day 6: New Haven – Rhode Island – Boston

Hotel: Doubletree by Hilton/Four Points by Sheraton/Radisson or equivalent

After visit Yale University, we will head to Newport, Rhode Island where is a high-end New England seaport town, extremely popular among the mega-rich of America. Travel along Ocean Drive to get beautiful scenic views and see the magnificent Breakers Mansion.

ITINERARY:

New Jersey → New Haven → Yale University Campus Tour (Optional, 60 mins) → Newport → The Breakers (Optional, 90 mins) → Boston Lobster Dinner (Optional, 60 mins)

❖ **Yale University**

Founded in 1701, this world-famous university is the third-oldest in the United States. This Ivy-League school is consistently ranked as one of the best institutions of higher learning in the entire world, and admission is extremely competitive.

❖ **The Breakers**

The Breakers mansion is not just one of the most famous but is the largest and grandest of the several historical Newport "cottages" that dot the ritzy coastline. The four-story building is located on 14 acres of waterfront property.

Day 7: Boston – New York

The trip will start in the city of Cambridge, MA where we will visit the Harvard University. Later, we will take pictures with the main academic building inside MIT. Another fun will begin as soon as you board the cruise ship and enjoy a breathtaking view of the Boston harbor.

ITINERARY:

Cambridge → Harvard University (60 mins) → MIT (15 mins) → Boston City tour → Boston Harbor Cruise (Optional, 60 mins) → Quincy Market (60 mins) → Head to airports in Boston and New York

Boston City Tour will also pass by: Old Trinity Cathedral, Hancock Building, Boston Athenaeum, Boston Park, Swan Lake Park, and overlooking the Golden Dome of the State House.

❖ **Harvard University**

One of the most famous institutions of higher learning in the world, Harvard University in Cambridge, MA has been standing since 1636, making it the oldest university in the United States. Tourists come for both history and the architecture.

❖ **MIT**

The Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Massachusetts is a research university known the world over for its highly selective and intense academics, and MIT alumni include 24 Nobel Prize winners and 22 Rhodes Scholars.

❖ **Boston Harbor Cruise**

See the famous Boston skyline like never before with a cruise of Boston Harbor. From the peak of the Prudential tower to the quaint North End, this beautiful and historic city is best viewed from the bay!

❖ **Quincy Market**

Quincy Market in the Faneuil Hall marketplace of downtown Boston is a historic building that still serves as a souvenir marketplace and food court today. The area has expanded to include two other marketplace buildings as well.

❖ **Old Trinity Cathedral**

Trinity Church is located in Boston's upscale Back Bay neighborhood. It is a parish of the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts, and the elaborate and ornate building has become a landmark and icon in downtown Boston.
