Itinerary

Day 1: Home – Seattle (Optional Morning Tour / Night Tour)

We will offer free airport pick-up service during 9:00AM-10:00PM. **Please wait for our tour guide at number 1 Baggage Claim area**, and then guests will be taken to the hotel to catch a rest. Guests are able to arrange the rest of day by their own, or join our optional Morning Tour or Night Tour. (*To arrange the tour, it requires at least 4 guests enrolled.)

(Morning tour: Flight arrivals before 12:00PM) Microsoft Corporate Headquarters – University of Washington

Founded in 1975, Microsoft is the worldwide leader in software, services, devices and solutions that help people and businesses realize their full potential. Guests will have a chance to visit the famous Building 92(Microsoft Corporate Headquarters) to learn Microsoft's fascinating history and everything about one of the world's largest and most influential company. (Inside tour; tours are subject to closures for private events.) Also, we will go to University of Washington, commonly referred to as UW, a public flagship research university based in Seattle. Founded in 1861, UW is one of the oldest universities on the west coast

and features one of the most highly regarded medical schools in the world. A new model for learning, collaborating and problem solving - the Global Innovation Exchange (GIX) has been launched here between two leading research universities, the University of Washington and Tsinghua University, with foundational support from Microsoft. It should also be reminded that the campus is famous for appreciating Cherry blossom.

(Night tour: Flight arrivals before 6:00PM) Seattle Fisherman Wharf 、 Kerry Park、 Starbucks Reserve Roastery and Tasting Room

We will firstly travel to Seattle Great Wheel, which is a giant Ferris wheel at Pier 57 on Elliott Bay in Seattle, Washington. With an overall height of 175 feet, it was the tallest Ferris wheel on the West Coast of the United States when it opened on June 29, 2012. Next stop is Kerry Park where visitors can have a panoramic city view of the entire Seattle. It is a perfect location for photography and if you see Space Needle with a backdrop of Mount Rainier in any marketing photos of Seattle, this is exactly where to take the pictures. In addition, the park was one of the many stops on the finale episode of the third season of Amazing Race. At the same time, we will visit **Starbucks Reserve Roastery and Tasting Room. It is more like a modern coffee factory. You will witness the machines roasting the freshest coffee beans and grinding the most concentrated coffee powder. You can also open your mind up, order a cup of the most creative coffee, or enjoy the latest Starbucks products. Here you can also see the whole process of unsealing and baking the original coffee beans.**

To reserve the seats of Morning or/and Night Tour:

1. Guests can pay the Morning or/and Night tour fee in advance, thus we will guarantee and save the seats for the guests.
2. If guest intends to join the tour but is not willing to pre-pay the tour fee, we will arrange the seats according to the availability of the arrival date. First come, first serve.
3. To arrange the Morning Tour or/and Night Tour, it requires at least 4 guests enrolled. If less than 4 passengers on the departure day, we will cancel the tour and issue a full refund to the guest.

Day 2: Olympia, WA – Portland

Visit Olympia, the capital city of the State of Washington, to see **the State House**. Travel north to Columbia River Gorge in 40 miles to the east of Portland. The Columbia River is the 4th largest river by volume in the nation, flows inside the Rocky Mountains. It covers and runs for 1000 miles along the border of two states, Oregon and Washington. The magnificent view of the valley includes **Multnomah**, a famous 620 feet falls. Our next stop is to see **salmon fish migration**. Ballard locks fish ladder (21 steps) is the biggest fish ladder among Northwestern America. Visitors will see the amazing moment of life. Next stop is Portland where we will visit **the International Rose Test Garden**, which was built in 1917 for the worldwide rose experiment. You can always see new types of roses growing here.

Later we will visit The **Pittock Mansion**, it is in the West Hills of Portland, Oregon is a beautiful mansion located on a scenic hilltop overlooking the city. Originally built for publisher Henry Pittock, this estate is now open to the public for touring.

Day 3: Crater Lake National Park(Summer)/ Portland In-depth City Tour (Winter)

Crater Lake National Park (Summer: Mid of April - October)

After breakfast, we will travel to Crater Lake National Park. Upon arrival, we will see the deepest lake in the United States and enjoy the beautiful scenery. The lake was formed after the collapse of mount mazama

- an ancient volcano that erupted approximately 7,700 years ago, the length of lake is 6 miles and width is 4 miles with a depth of 1932 feet.

Portland In-depth City Tour (Winter: October – Mid of April)

After breakfast, we'll go to **Pioneer Courthouse Square**, also known as Portland's living room, is a public space occupying a full 40,000-square-foot city block in the center of downtown Portland. We will visit Japanese American Historical Plaza, we will see the Steel Bridge, Hawthorne Bridge. And later we will visit RoseQuarter(outside visit).

The Grotto is a Catholic shrine in Portland is in a cave on a cliff. The whole area takes up about 62 acres and features several thousand feet of trails, making this a peaceful place for a reflective walk.

Day 4: Woodburn Outlets Shopping – Seattle

Woodburn is the largest outlets in Oregon with more than 100 named brands. Tips: Oregon State is free of sales tax! Enjoy shopping! Enjoy saving! Later we will return to your departure locations.

Day 5: Mt. Rainier National Park

Mt. Rainier is the tallest volcano of the Continental United States, the 5th tallest mountain of the entire US territory. The mountain top is covered by snow all year round. When snow melts, snow water flows down in a large volume, which creates beautiful waterfalls and vast lakes meanwhile irrigates the forest land. Mount Rainier is circled by the 93-mile-long Wonderland Trail and is covered by several glaciers and snowfields totaling some 35 square miles. Carbon Glacier is the largest glacier by volume in the contiguous United States, while Emmons Glacier is the largest glacier by area. About 1.8 million people visit Mount Rainier National Park each year. Mount Rainier is a popular peak for mountaineering with some 10,000 attempts per year with approximately 50% making it to the summit. We will go along the Wonderland Trail by stopping at 1-2 scenic spots. (According to the situation of the day) . In the summer, we will lead you traverse the Volcano mountains.

Day 6: Olympic National Park

Olympic National Park is a national park located in the Olympic Peninsula, WA. The park consists of four regions: the Pacific coastline, alpine areas, the west side temperate rainforest and the forests of the drier east side. With nearly one million acres, Olympic national park encompasses several distinctly different ecosystems and protects a rich mosaic of natural and cultural history. It protects 73 miles of wild Pacific coast. Tide pools, sandy beaches and rocky cliffs can all be found here. At the center of the peninsula are the majestic glacier capped Olympic Mountains. Hurricane Ridge, over a mile high, offers spectacular views of mountains, wildflowers, deer, black bear, and other wildlife. (If we can't drive to the Hurricane due to the bad weather, we will go to the other attractions in Olympic National Park.) The 10-acre natural lake, Lake Crescent, located at an elevation of 600 feet is a pristine area that provides visitors with an extraordinary place for recreation and relaxation. Only a few places of interest allow the automobiles to enter the natural beauty. There is a wealth of outdoor activities with over 900 miles of

trails traversing the vast interior of the recognized wildness. When going back to Seattle, you can take the Bainbridge Island ferry to enjoy the breathtaking views of Seattle’s coastline. atmosphere can be found everywhere all year round. Enjoy shopping of delicate European souvenirs and taste the authentic German food and beer, or try on some traditional German costume clothes.

Note: Upon your tour completion, we will send you to the Seattle - Tacoma International Airport (SEA) only. Please book your flights departing after 20:00. Or you can return to Seattle Chinatown (502 South King St. Seattle, WA 98104).
